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In the news... The British Army celebrates 100 years of apprenticeships



The British Army celebrates 100 years of Apprenticeships (October 2023):

The first temporary Apprentice College opened in Aldershot in 1923 and was replaced by the Boys' Technical School in Chepstow in 1924. Over the following 65 years **50,000 apprentices** graduated from 16 colleges, learning various trades including Vehicle Mechanic, Radar Technician, Aircraft Technician, Instrument Technician, Fitter, and Gun Fitter amongst others.

In 2004, the last Technical Foundation College in Arborfield closed when the Army offered modern Apprenticeships which are now delivered in the Initial Trade Training Schools and in the workplace. Since 2004, there have been 106,945 achievements. We now have 6,000 apprentices starts every year.

We asked Col Craig Terblanche – Branch Colonel of the Education and Training Services:

How has the apprenticeship offer changed /developed over the last 100 years?

"Following WWI, the Army needed skilled tradesmen to help modernise its forces to meet the demands of mechanisation. The original apprenticeships where only for boys and focused on mechanical skills which were delivered in college settings. Today, our apprentices (both male and female) are leading us into the Digital Age, learning in the workplace, gaining nationally recognised qualifications in one of 39 standards, whilst getting paid, and learning valuable life skills."

Online prospectus and application system used by all Y11's in the Sheffield area to apply for sixth forms, colleges and training providers.



Can be used to **research** post 16 providers and courses without the need to be logged into your account



Once logged into your account you can research, favourite, make and edit applications to your choice of providers and courses.



When you have completed your applications, you can use Sheffield Progress to track your applications and manage course offers.


Did you know that Sheffield Progress is not just for Y11's? The site can be used by anyone wanting to research the types of courses available after Year 11 as part of your career planning in any year. You do not require a 'login' to search for courses. Only Y11's will receive a personal 'login' for the site. Visit: www.sheffieldprogress.co.uk to enter.



Head to www.shefieldprogress.co.uk to have a look around. You may find some new ideas to look into! There are so many courses to study after Y11, but it is

important to start early so that you can work towards the grades needed and research your ideas in more detail to help you make important decisions when you finally reach Y11. Students in Y11 are currently using this platform to research, make and manage their post 16 applications which have to be completed by the end of January!

By clicking on the tabs at the top of the home page you can find out information about courses, providers in our area, qualifications, (including types and levels) and much more. You can use the search facility to look up course interest areas or search the list of providers to see what types of courses and qualifications they offer.





Info for our <u>Year 11's</u> relating to open events, Sheffield Progress and application processes.

Year 11's are in the midst of visiting sixth form schools, colleges and training providers throughout the next few months to help them find out more about the huge range of post 16 courses and learning options on offer across the region. Here are a few reminders for Year 11's to help you stay on track with your post 16 application processes:

- Double check that you have completed and submitted your personal statement to your tutor or via the
 email provided by Mr Miskell. Once these have been checked they can be copied into Sheffield Progress.
 Make sure you run a final check to make sure you haven't missed anything and that you have spell
 checked your work.
- Y11 careers meetings are in full swing and every student will be seen by Sarah Dempsey for a 1-1 meeting between now and mid January. If you have an urgent need to be seen, please pop and see Sarah ASAP in the LRC Careers Office.
- Ensure you have the latest open event listing which is available on the school website and in the careers
 folder on SharePoint. Some places require you to book your place when visiting, so double check before
 you go by visiting the providers website or giving them a call.
- Your new Sheffield Progress grades are available on Bromcom and will be updated automatically onto Sheffield Progress in the next few weeks. It is essential that you check the entry requirements of courses against your predicted grades as these must match or your application will be returned to you.

Sheffield Progress in an online prospectus and application system for young people in Y11 to apply to school sixth forms, colleges and training providers as part of their Post 16 Options process.

Students in all year groups can access Sheffield Progress without needing an account to research the range of learning opportunities associated with their own interest areas. For example, you could research courses such as A Level subjects at Tapton School Sixth Form, Art & Design at Sheffield College, Engineering at UTC, Construction at Nacro, Sport at Sheffield Wednesday, Beauty at White Rose, etc There are so many providers and courses to look at which should give you helpful information and inspiration for the future.

Emergency services make bonfire and firework safety plea...



South Yorkshire's police and fire services are urging people to be fire safe and 999 wise around Halloween and Bonfire Night this autumn.

Many call outs involved bonfires that had grown out of control, and trees that had been set on fire by stray fireworks. Others involved cars and wheelie bins being set alight.

Every year we attend countless incidents involving bonfires that have got out of control, or fireworks that have gone astray. In more serious cases, people have found themselves seriously hurt.

Our main advice around these times of year, especially Bonfire Night, is to attend organised displays. These are safer and far more spectacular!

Did You know?

- It is against the law to carry fireworks in public if you are under 18.
- Fireworks must NOT be sold to anyone under the age of 18
- It is an offence to throw or set-off a firework in the street or public place.

 This could result in prosecution and a fine of up to £5000!
- It is an offence to let fireworks off during night hours (11pm to 7am) except on Bonfire night when it is extended to midnight.
- On average, 130 fires on homes and buildings in the UK are started by fireworks every year.
